Exciting Updates Ahead: Renovating Our Science Rooms

Now that the merger process is complete and we have decided not to move forward with it, our attention turns to our next important building project. We plan to seek public approval in January to renovate our science rooms, and we want to share the details with you.

Why Focus on the Science Rooms?

If you've had the chance to visit the third floor of our school, you might instantly understand our choice. The current science rooms are reminiscent of a different era—likely last updated in the late 1960s.

Why Do They Need to Be Updated?

The landscape of education has evolved significantly over the years. Students' methods and tools for classwork and experiments have transformed, incorporating computers and new technology. Unfortunately, our current science rooms are inadequate for modern learning and experimentation. Additionally, many safety standards have changed since our facilities were last updated. While we've been "grandfathered" in, it's time to modernize our physical space to ensure a safe and effective learning environment.

What Else Is Included in the Project?

In addition to renovating the science rooms, we also plan to install a generator for the school. Given the increasing frequency and severity of storms, having a reliable power source is essential. As a designated Red Cross site, we

must be prepared to serve our community in emergencies, ensuring we can operate effectively during critical times.

What Will This Project Cost?

We anticipate that the total cost for this project will be approximately \$3.6 million.

How Will This Be Funded?

We have an existing building payment that will soon come off the books, making this the ideal time for a project that won't increase taxes. We will finance this through bonding for 20 years, and thanks to state aid, we can assure you that this will not increase school taxes.

We appreciate your support and look forward to enhancing our school's facilities for the benefit of our students and community. Stay tuned for more updates as we approach the vote in January!

Most Valuable Student (MVS) Contest. The 2025 MVS application is now open. Applications can be found online at enf.elks.org/MVS.

The application deadline is November 12, 2024.

The Elks National Foundation (ENF) awards 500 four-year scholarships based on academics, leadership, and financial need. National awards range from \$1,000 per year to \$7,500 per year. The national awards will be announced in April 2025.

MVS scholarships are for students pursuing a four-year degree on a full-time basis (minimum of 12 semester hours) at a U.S. college or

university next school year. Some important applicant details include:

- *Current high school seniors (or equivalent) who are citizens of the United States are eligible to apply.
- * Applicants do not have to be related to a member of the Elks.
- * Male and female students compete separately. Applicants select from a list of the Lodges closest to their home address zip code. Please have your students choose Glens Falls Elks Lodge BPOE 81as their sponsoring Lodge. Complete details can be found at enf.elks.org/MVS.





