Grade 7-12 Cell Phone/PED Policy

The increased student use of cell phones has had a damaging effect on learning, school culture and climate, and mental health. Johnsborg Central School is adopting what will be known as the "Off and Away" policy for student cell phones

and all Personal Electronic Devices (PEDs). Personal Electronic Devices include cell phones, earbuds/airpods, smart watches and any other electronic communication device.

Students in grades 7-12 are not permitted to use personal electronic devices during instructional time, study halls, in classrooms, or locker rooms. In addition, personal electronic devices are not permitted during detention, in-school suspension, or during the disciplinary process. Due to confidentiality, the use of personal electronic devices are not permitted in the Health Office, Wellness Center, or Guidance Office.

All student PEDs including cell phones will be turned off and put away at all times during academic instruction and study halls. PEDs must be powered fully off and not in airplane mode. This does not mean turned over on the desk.

The use of PEDs including cell phones for any reason in school is a privilege. The use of PEDs/cell phones is defined as but not limited to: talking, messaging, Internet usage, game playing, and any other software usage found on a PED/cell phone.

Inappropriate use of PEDs/cell phones will not be tolerated. This includes, but is not limited to, cheating, sending disruptive messages, searching for inappropriate content, taking and sending unauthorized photos or videos, acts of bullying, threatening, harassing or menacing in any manner. Students who fail to comply with these rules or refuse to hand their PEDs/cellphones to a staff member when directed to do so will receive additional consequences ranging from detention to suspension from school.

Students seen using their PEDs/cell phones during unauthorized times will be subject to disciplinary action and/or face the loss of the PED/cell phone.

1st offense: Electronic Device turned into the Principal's Office for the remainder of the school day

2nd offense: Electronic Device turned into Principal's Office, parent/guardian must pick-up device and loss of privilege for 10 days

3rd offense: Loss of Electronic Device and parent/guardian must pick-up device, meeting with Administration before privileges are restored

Electronic Devices required for medical purposes will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis. The school is not responsible for loss, theft, or damage to any cell phones or any other electronic devices.

A committee of 7-12 teachers, Board of Education Members, and Administration has been established to discuss additional restrictions and/or changes to the personal electronic device policy during the 2024-2025 school year. (adopted by JCS BOE August 2024)

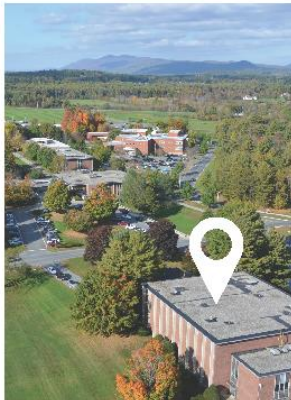

 - **Sports Physicals have been scheduled for 10/10. Students need to sign up with the nurse ASAP.**
- If I have contacted you via letter or by phone and requested a physical be submitted, please do so as soon as possible.
- Remind your kids to drink plenty of water and get to bed at a reasonable time; a well-hydrated and well-rested student will learn more easily!! These have been very busy weeks here at school, so getting enough rest cannot be encouraged enough!
